**A**t the coast and further offshore, marine developments such as ports and wind-farms bring a new set of challenges to archaeologists, whether they be curators, consultants or contractors. Current changes in law, policy and best practice are requiring far greater attention to the marine historic environment at all stages of the development process.

The aim of this course is to provide participants with an overview of marine development-led archaeology and the range of solutions that can be applied to investigating possible impacts.

The objectives of the course are:

- To familiarise participants with the context within which marine development-led archaeology takes place;
- To alert participants to the range of sites that may be implicated by marine development, and the contexts within which they occur;
- To give participants a grounding in technical and operational aspects of marine investigation;
- To provide participants with case-study examples upon which they can draw in future.

The course will provide an introduction that is based directly on archaeological experience from a wide range of marine projects around the UK. By the end of the course, participants will be expected to have a confident understanding of why and how marine development-led archaeology is undertaken, and to be able to appraise both the archaeological requirements of marine development, and the appropriateness of investigation options.
