

Story of an artefact

An artefact is chosen by the learner. Either an artefact seen at a museum/event/in the landscape or from Wessex Archaeology's Flicker pictures https://www.flickr.com/search/?

The learner then writes a story based around the artefact.

Good questions to frame the story around:

- > Who made the object?
- > Why was it made?
- > What was it used for?
- > How did it end up in the ground/sea?
- > Where was the artefact found?
- > Who found it?

The stories could include factual information such as: key words, archaeological techniques, information about the period in which the artefact was made.
